

This is a ballot from the Irish general election held on May 17, 2002 in the Wicklow constituency. Voters were electing five members to Dáil Éireann (the lower house of the Irish Parliament).

Multi-Winner Flections

Ireland uses Single Transferable Vote (STV) for parliamentary elections. This proportional representation system:

- Allows voters to rank candidates in order of preference (1, 2, 3, etc.)
- Elects multiple representatives per constituency (Wicklow had 5 seats)
- Ensures seats are allocated proportionally to the votes received
- Transfers votes from eliminated candidates to remaining candidates based on voter preferences

Voters can rank as many or as few candidates as they wish. Constituencies typically elect 3-5 members.

The system, which has been used for Dáil Éireann elections since 1921, promotes proportional representation and ensures that smaller parties and independents can win seats in line with their support.

STV allows Irish voters to express their true preferences while ensuring fair representation of different political viewpoints in each constituency.
