Maltese Local Elections Using STV

These two ballots are from Malta's 2024 local council elections, held in Birżebbuġa and Marsaskala. Voters were electing nine councilors in each locality using the **Single Transferable Vote (STV)** system. The entire council is elected freshly every five years.

All ballots are printed in the same order, grouped by party, in alphabetical order. Some people believe that the Green Party picked its Maltese name as "Alternattiva Demokratika" in order to be listed first.

Malta has used STV for all elections—including local councils, national parliament, and European Parliament—since gaining independence in 1964. The system ensures proportional representation by allowing voters to rank candidates and transferring votes based on preferences, giving fair chances to smaller parties and independents.
